American patriot Patrick Henry reportedly proclaimed, "He is the greatest patriot who stops the most quills." Contour strip cropping in conjunction with grassed waterways and prairie crop rotation are practices that reduce soil erosion. Without these conservation practices the soil eroding off the field would more than double. Staff from Sauk County Conservation Planning & Zoning Department works in partnership with landowners to install contour strips that follow the natural contours of the land. Wisconsin has a long history of private-public conservation partnerships, especially in this area of the state dating back to 1933 when the first federal soil conservation projects in the nation were carried out in southwestern Wisconsin.
